

to be put in, then we would go to a random method of selecting people in Douglas County so that we would not impact on the majority of black people who are involved in this program. That would make a difference in my attitude about this. But I'm going to take... Senator Bohlke shows me four counties but if you look at the four counties and consider the total percentage, all right, Senator Bohlke, let me ask you this. Are the four counties Adams, Clay, Webster and Knuckolls?

SENATOR BOHLKE: Yes.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: All right, the number of ADC recipients in Adams County is 851 or 1.8 percent of the total. In Clay County, there would be 158 or .3 of 1 percent of the total. Webster County has 46 recipients or .1 of 1 percent. Knuckolls County has 76 persons or .2 of 1 percent. In Douglas County, 45.2 percent of the total ADC recipients are located, 45 percent, and all of them are to be impacted. All of them are to be placed under these restrictions and limitations. I'm going to tell you, I'm disappointed that Mary Harvey and other black people went along with this. I really am.

SENATOR BERNARD-STEVENS: One minute.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: They owed something more to the black community than what they delivered and they get jobs and consideration because they're willing to turn their back on their own community. That is not what I'm about and I am opposed to the inclusion of just these four counties with a relatively few people involved as being projected as a way to overcome my objection to the inequitable distribution and experimental aspect of this bill. And there are other items in the bill, Senator Bohlke, with which I disagree. I had an amendment relative to the standard of need. I don't see that in you all's amendment. Senator Wasely stands here and talks about how people have worked together. Well, they work together to take things that they want for whatever their particular agenda is, but I'm interested in those poor people who are going to be hurt...

SENATOR BERNARD-STEVENS: Time.
