

SENATOR BOHLKE: But that's if the one...what we're trying to do gets adopted which collapsed a bunch of those amendments together, Senator Hall.

SENATOR HALL: Run that by me again one more time.

SENATOR BOHLKE: This one...the amendment that's in the Journal right now...

SENATOR HALL: Yes.

SENATOR BOHLKE: ...takes a number of those that were filed...

SENATOR HALL: Right.

SENATOR BOHLKE: ...and puts them into one amendment.

SENATOR HALL: And I haven't had time to read this one that's found on 2408, but does it...does it include the amendment I have filed?

SENATOR BOHLKE: On...

SENATOR HALL: On this bill?

SENATOR BOHLKE: No, I don't think so.

SENATOR HALL: How did we go about the process of deciding which amendments to incorporate and which not?

SENATOR BOHLKE: There was pretty much a request from General File from people. It was discussed on the floor.

SENATOR HALL: Well, I remember that you and I discussed the issue of at least two amendments, one that I brought up dealing with the money for the family planning issue and you asked that it...that I take it off and put it over on the budget bill, and I did that. And I had another one that was pending on this bill. I filed it for Select File and it's still pending and, at that time, it was...and I believe now it's lying about 15 or 16 and I just wondered what process you went through to decide which amendments to incorporate in the substitute amendment and those that were not addressed, because, obviously, based on just from looking at it, it's only approximately four pages long.
