

SENATOR HALL: Mr. President.

CLERK: All right, Senator Hall...

SENATOR BERNARD-STEVENS: Senator Bohlke.

SENATOR BOHLKE: Yes, a point of clarification. I'm sorry, did you announce that number nine, that that would be first?

SENATOR BERNARD-STEVENS: No. Senator Bohlke, all I'm doing is we're letting the members know there are nine divisions, where those divisions are and then I will be asking you in what order you care to pick them up.

SENATOR BOHLKE: Thank you.

CLERK: Mr. President, pursuant to Senator Hall's request, I have in front of me AM2405. You'll find it on page 2408 of the Journal. The first division will be all of pages 1, pages 2, all of page 3 through line 22 on page 4. Pages 1, 2, 3, through line 22 on page 4. The second division...well, Senator, you're going to have to reference it in your Journal...

SENATOR BEUTLER: Right, but are you counting amendment pages or are you counting...

CLERK: I'm counting amendment pages. I'm not counting Journal pages, I'm counting amendment pages.

SENATOR BEUTLER: Okay.

CLERK: So every twenty-seventh line starts a new page in your Journal.

SENATOR BEUTLER: Right. And the first one ends at 22 on page 4?

CLERK: No, the first one will end at starting with Section 21, everything up to Section 21 is the first amendment.

SENATOR BEUTLER: Okay. Thank you.

CLERK: Okay? The second amendment will be all of what appears to be Section 21. The third amendment will be all of what
