SENATOR BEUTLER: Thank you.

CLERK: The fourth amendment will be all of what is Section 23. The fifth amendment will be the language that begins on page 9, line 3, strike the word "may" et cetera, through what is the last page of the amendment through line 2 of the last page of the amendment. It ends with the word, insert the word "shall". The sixth component will be what is listed as item or Section 3, starts on page 11 through the word "income". The seventh division is what appears to be Section IV on page...starts on page 13, ends with the word "stricken". The eighth amendment consists of the following language. We're subdividing subsection 5 or Section 5 there so the eighth division will be on page 22, line 8, strike the words "previous year" and insert "two previous calendar years". And the ninth division will be the balance of that section beginning with the words "and in lines 14" up through the word "survey". The operative date provisions that you will find in Section 6 will follow with the first division because the impacts decision or issues contained in the first division. So all of item 6 on the last page of the printed amendment will be part of the first division.

SENATOR BERNARD-STEVENS: Those are the nine divisions. We will strive to get something handed out to the body that might have a page reference on. Senator Bohlke, which order of the nine would you...how would you prefer to take those up?

SENATOR BERNARD-STEVENS: The last division first, you'd like to do so?

SENATOR BOHLKE: Yes, and then go straight down in order.

SENATOR BERNARD-STEVENS: Then we start with number 1 and go all the way through?
