

under call. We...there's been a request for a roll call vote. We're looking for Senator Avery, Bromm, Brashear and Pirsch. We're looking for Senators Schellpeper, Schimek and Dierks. The house is under call. Senator Avery, would you check in, please. Thank you, sir. We're looking for Senators Schellpeper, Dierks, Schimek. Senator Schellpeper, Dierks, Schimek and Withem, the house is under call. Senator Beutler, we have all but Senator Schellpeper. How do you wish to...do you wish to wait, or shall we...can we continue?

SENATOR BEUTLER: I'd wait just a bit, Senator.

SENATOR BERNARD-STEVENS: It's your prerogative, Senator, we'll stand by. Waiting for Senator Schellpeper. The house is under call. Senator Schimek, would you check in, please. All senators have arrived that are not excused. The question is, shall the first division under discussion, which is the ninth division, be agreed to? All those in favor vote aye, opposed vote nay. Excuse me, a roll call vote was requested. Mr. Clerk.

CLEPK: (Roll call vote taken. See page 2443 of the Legislative Journal.) 32 ayes, 0 nays on the adoption of the...that portion of the amendment as offered by Senator Bohlke.

SENATOR BERNARD-STEVENS: That portion is agreed to. We now go to the second division, which would actually be on the sheet the first division in number. Senator Bohlke, do you wish...and would raise the call. Senator Bohlke, do you wish to open on that particular section? (Bohlke amendment, FA271, appears on pages 2443-45 of the Legislative Journal.)

SENATOR BOHLKE: Thank you, Senator Bernard-Stevens, I will and then probably will have some time either to Senator Pirsch or Senator Crosby, because this part of the amendment speaks to what was previously LB 658. And as you recall, at one point in time there was a vote on the floor that certainly supported overwhelmingly the...how it occurs now in the welfare reform package, and that is that the ADC payments will be made in the last trimester and the Medicaid eligibility for prenatal care is changed from 133 to 150 percent of the federal poverty level. There was one time that on LB 658, that's where we did the discussion. This simply was an agreement between Senator Pirsch and Senator Crosby to recognize this in what previously was Senator Pirsch's priority bill and move it over into the welfare
