SENATOR CROSBY PRESIDING

The New Jersey article, that I haven't had a chance to speak to, we did talk to representatives there today, and what they told us is that percentage that people quote is such a small percentage. If you remember the time before on this bill we quoted that New Jersey percentage about the number of reduced teen pregnancies. And people said, well that isn't representative, so that doesn't apply. We're talking about the very same percentage and the very same policy or philosophy holds true. When we talked to the officials there they said there could be any number of things happening within a state when it is at that low of a percentage. So I certainly think in removing...considering the family cap and looking at anything that happens in New Jersey in that newspaper article is something that doesn't apply. I continue to oppose the Lindsay amendment.
