SENATOR CHAMBERS: I support Senator Wesely's amendment.

SPEAKER WITHEM: Thank you. Senator Maurstad, on the Wesely amendment.

SENATOR MAURSTAD: I rise to oppose the Wesely amendment because I think it approves the amendment or approves the language, and I don't support this section, so I'm going to oppose it for that reason. I don't think that this section is particularly needed or necessary from two different perspectives. One, if you go along with Senator Wesely is disappointed in what's occurred relative to the work product in the past, and I guess I have no reason to believe that that would change. And the other perspective is that I think that even if they came up with a good work product, that their work product could probably never meet the expectations of those that would like to see it. So for that reason, I am opposed to the underlying amendment and I am opposed to Senator Wesely's amendment because he makes it better.
