

CLERK: Senator Chambers would move to amend, Mr. President. (See FA283 found on page 2476 of the Legislative Journal.)

SENATOR LINDSAY: Senator Chambers, to open on your amendment.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Mr. President, members of the Legislature, this that I am wearing was bestowed on me by my fellow culture corner inhabitant, terminator, but today you can see I am laying it aside, and assuming the role of the facilitator. This is an amendment that would help the bill, at least the part of it that we are dealing with here. On page 5, of this amendment that we are dealing with, in line 27, after the word "Roundtable" would be inserted the date, "not later than December 1, 1996." There is no date currently by which this report must be given over to the roundtable by the Department of Labor, and I would like to see if Senator Wesely and Senator Bohlke would consider requiring that the information developed be provided to the Clerk of the Legislature also, and that way we would have direct access to this information. So if Senator Wesely is here, maybe he is going...oh, Senator Bohlke is here. I'd like to ask Senator Bohlke a question, Mr. President.

SENATOR LINDSAY: Senator Bohlke.

SENATOR BOHLKE: Yes.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Senator Bohlke, would you mind us including language also that would say this information, a copy of this study or whatever the term is that we use to designate the findings of the Department of Labor, a copy would be provided to the Clerk of the Legislature.

SENATOR BOHLKE: I would have no objection.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Thank you. And, Senator Crosby, I can understand...oh, she is back there. You are wondering why the Department of Labor is not doing this already. There are a number of things which I wonder why we have to put in statute, but since we do have that capacity, since it seems that on occasion we must do this, instead of arguing with them and trying to persuade them to do something, putting the directive will be using the power that we have. So I will ask that we adopt this date and then I will see if Senator Bohlke will work with me to put some language to put another report in the Clerk's Office.
