SENATOR CHAMBERS: Mr. President, members of the Legislature, the first time on the floor that in front of everybody I offer Senator Witek a date and she refuses it. I hope the rest of you will accept this date. It says the report shall be turned in to the roundtable not later than December 1st, 1996, which will be a year sooner than the roundtable's report. So this gives the Department of Labor plenty of time to do what it is going to do, and then it gives plenty of time for the roundtable to take that report and do something with it. So all this amendment does is offer a date, and I hope you will adopt it.

SENATOR LINDSAY: Thank you, Senator Chambers. You've heard the closing. The question is, shall the Chambers amendment to the Bohlke amendment be adopted? All those in favor vote aye, those opposed vote nay. Have you all voted? Have you all voted? Have you all voted that care to vote? Record, Mr. Clerk.

ASSISTANT CLERK: 26 ayes, 1 nay on the adoption of Senator Chambers' amendment.

SENATOR LINDSAY: The amendment is adopted. Mr. Clerk, next item on the desk.

ASSISTANT CLERK: Senator Chambers would move to amend. Senator, would you like me to read it?

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Mr. Clerk.

ASSISTANT CLERK: On page 5, line 27 after "Roundtable" insert "and the Clerk of the Legislature."

SENATOR LINDSAY: Senator Chambers, to open on your amendment.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Mr. President, members of the Legislature, all this amendment would do is what Senator Bohlke agreed to, and that is to say when the Labor Department finishes its study, whatever information it turns over to the roundtable, it will also provide the Clerk of the Legislature, and I hope that you will accept this amendment.
