So, please, if you're concerned about economic development and job creation and the things that we've talked about on this floor, this is an effort to take a resource of people capable of working, in many cases they want to work, and now matching them up with the jobs that people are looking for workers. It only makes sense. And I will give the rest of my time to Senator Chambers. Thank you.

SENATOR LINDSAY: Senator Chambers.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Mr. President, members of the Legislature, I hope Senator Wehrbein is here. I hope Senator Wehrbein is here and paying attention. Senator Wehrbein, you said something this morning about ac...oh, sit down and relax. I want you to just kick back and enjoy this. You had said something about us all acting in good faith in trying to move on this bill and get some things done. I've actually carried some amendments. I've supported some amendments. I am supporting this amendment, and I am offering the close, and I recommend that we do adopt it because it will give us the kind of information we need to work toward providing the job opportunities that this bill says it is interested in. It's not going to do the job by itself. But we need this as a step toward that goal and I hope you all will support it. And, Senator Bohlke, if I have any other time and you need it, I give it back to you.
