SENATOR CROSBY: Well,...

SENATOR WESELY: ...and the state is checked by the federal government...

SENATOR CROSBY: Yeah. Yeah. Okay.

SENATOR WESELY: ...on their error rate.

SENATOR CROSBY: Yeah, well, I think in the electronic age it does sound like a much better system and so I will support it but I was interested to hear that it only...that Senator Janssen said about \$400 because to put one into a grocery store he said he thought it cost him, because that is another expense for business. But probably, in the long run, it would pay off in easier accounting for them too. Right?

SENATOR WESELY: That would be part of the study...

SENATOR CROSBY: Yeah.

SENATOR WESELY: ...to see how that would play out.

SENATOR CROSBY: Yeah. Okay. Thank you.

SENATOR WESELY: Uh-huh.

SENATOR LINDSAY: No further lights. Senator Bohlke, do you care to close on your amendment? Senator Bohlke waives. The question is the adoption of the the Bohlke amendment to LB 455.
