

CLERK: Nothing further on the bill at this time, Mr. President.

SENATOR HALL: Senator Maurstad.

SENATOR MAURSTAD: Mr. President, I would move to advance LB 742 to E & R for engrossment.

SENATOR HALL: You've heard the motion. All those in favor vote aye. Opposed. The bill is advanced. LB 742A, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: Mr. President, 742A, no E & R, Senator. Senator Bromm and Bohlke would move to amend, AM2184.

SENATOR HALL: Senator Bromm.

SENATOR BROMM: Thank you, Mr. President. This is the amendment, I believe, and I don't have it in front of me, that adds \$80,000. And this is to provide some extra money that Department of Education estimated they would need to implement the waivers and handle the additional waivers that we expect will be processed and allowable under the amendment that we adopted. This, we think, will have substantial...this will have substantial savings in costs, we hope, and it is going to take some time. This has the emergency clause that we added. We'd expect those waiver requests to be processed and started as soon as the bill becomes law, or shortly thereafter. And so that's what it does. That was part of the whole process that we had to put together with the amendment. And, with that, if Senator Bernard-Stevens or anyone else...I think we may have a substitution. Let Senator Bohlke do what she would like to do with the amendment. (Laughter.)

SENATOR HALL: Thank you, Senator Bromm. Senator Bohlke.

SENATOR BOHLKE: Yes, Mr. Speaker. Knowing that this has been my specialty today, I would say that we pull this amendment.

SENATOR HALL: Thank you, Senator Bohlke, the amendment is withdrawn. Next item, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: Mr. President, Senator Bernard-Stevens has the next amendment. (Bernard-Stevens amendment, AM2480, appears on page 2490 of the Legislative Journal.)

SENATOR HALL: Senator Bernard-Stevens, you're recognized to
