SENATOR BERNARD-STEVENS: Yeah, this is the...that we talked about, this is the transfer, the actual transfer of the dollars. The bill has it in the A bill that we save \$6 million. This is the transfer to the Cash Reserve of the extra that we...that we actually saved, so we would transfer \$3,032,333 to the Cash Reserve. That transfer would take place June 16th, 1997. So it still keeps the 6 million in the...I said thousand, still keeps the 6 million on the actual sheet. Actually, it keeps all of it on the actual sheet, but we transfer it in June 16th of '97 to the Cash Reserve Fund, and would urge its adoption.

SENATOR HALL: Thank you, Senator Bernard-Stevens. Senator Warner, your light is next.

SENATOR WARNER: Now is the time, David, right. I rise to support the amendment. I think it's fine. (Laughter.)

SENATOR HALL: Thank you, Senator Warner. Senator Robinson, your light is next.

SENATOR ROBINSON: Mr. President, members of the body, I stand to support the amendment. I think Senator Wehrbein put it this way, if this amendment passes, we put the money in the bank, if we don't, we put it in the checking account. Thank you.

SENATOR HALL: Thank you, Senator Robinson. Senator Bernard-Stevens, you're recognized to close on your amendment. He waives. Question is the adoption of the amendment. All in favor vote aye, opposed nay. Have you all voted? Record, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 31 ayes, 0 nays, Mr. President, on the adoption of Senator Bernard-Stevens' amendment.

SENATOR HALL: The amendment is adopted. Anything further on the bill?
