

deterrent then to actually using the weapon. When we drafted it, I think we should have put in the Class III, which allows you to graduated levels up for possession, possession by a felon, or use of a weapon, and that's the type of thing, again, that gets...that should be considered. There is a, I think, a provision that includes to visit that area that if Senator Abboud and Senator Chambers agree on, can work on some numbers that they can then present to the Legislature on the amounts that are appropriate for crack and powder cocaine that we talked about extensively at first reading, that if there is something that can tie that into a basis that ties into street values or to what a particular level might be considered dealing, for lack of a better term, I guess, and what levels, et cetera, if something like that can be worked out, then it allows that also to be visited by the Legislature. There is an op...there will be an opportunity to look at the question of, and something that I know Senator Bernard-Stevens has been actively involved in, from 988, LB 988 last year, as you all will recall, was the juvenile crime bill. In that juvenile crime bill, we provided for the construction of a secure youth facility, basically, a youth prison. There have been some problems in siting that, in finding a location for that facility because of the cost of the land, and that is something, again, the Legislature ought to speak to that, to that issue, so that the administration...the administration has requested guidance. They just...they will go wherever we want them to but they just want to know which direction we go. It allows us to direct the administration which direction to go on that, and that issue is also included in these...in these amendments. The issue of parole eligibility, as far as the judge setting that up, will be another one that will be...that will be, or determining the minimum term on that, I guess, or not even that, but that will be set out before and we will get to that separately, and these are going to be divided out so that we are going to vote on each of these that I am talking about separately. I just want to give you an overview before we get to the amendment itself, give you an overview, I guess, of what's coming, and then when we separate these out, so that we get a chance to vote on each of these, then we can talk about them more in depth at each time. The...it also adds in...the only, I guess, the only add-on, really, bill that will be included is Senator Witek's Sex Offender Registration Act, which there is, my understanding, and I am going to allow, Senator, when we get to that portion of the amendment, will allow Senator Witek to describe that more in depth, but it will allow...I think will allow the state to
