

SENATOR LINDSAY: Well, the alternative is, Senator Pirsch, and I would prefer not to do it, but we ought...we ought to debate the bill, I mean the provisions of the bill, and if we don't get a chance to debate them while we are going through people's bills that they did not prioritize or whatever that they want to add on to the crime bill, then it delays things as far as when I would file a motion for cloture.

SENATOR PIRSCH: Well, I...okay, so I see that with your amendment you have included only certain parts of the bill, so we won't be discussing the bill on your amendment either. We will just be discussing...

SENATOR LINDSAY: The major part.

SENATOR PIRSCH: ...certain parts.

SENATOR LINDSAY: Those...yeah.

SENATOR PIRSCH: And at the end of cloture, say eight hours, and this could be divisible, right, this amendment?

SENATOR LINDSAY: It will be, as I indicated, it will be (inaudible), right.

SENATOR PIRSCH: It will be divisible, so in each area of this amendment, we could spend the whole eight hours, maybe, on a couple of provisions...

SENATOR LINDSAY: Oh, sure.

SENATOR PIRSCH: ...in your amendment.

SENATOR LINDSAY: And I think you could spend eight hours on any given amendment.

SENATOR PIRSCH: So, at the end of eight hours, and there is a move for cloture, whatever is in your amendment we will then vote on, as well as the part of the amendment that we end cloture on. We will take a vote on that.

SENATOR LINDSAY: Right.

SENATOR PIRSCH: And then we will take a vote only on your amendment.
