

SENATOR LINDSAY: I think in that circumstance you've described I think that would be correct.

SENATOR BEUTLER: Do you think it probably would be fair to say that a group of kids who did that would have no idea from their moral training that they just committed a felony?

SENATOR LINDSAY: I think they would have commi...they would have known they did something wrong.

SENATOR BEUTLER: Yes, definitely.

SENATOR LINDSAY: I mean I don't think that most kids know whether something is a felony or a misdemeanor or even know what the words mean, in an awful lot of cases, so...

SENATOR HALL: Time. Senator Lindsay, your light is next.

SENATOR LINDSAY: I'm going to yield to Chambers.

SENATOR HALL: Senator Chambers, you are recognized.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Mr. President and members of the Legislature, I want to ask Senator Lindsay a question or two about this section because it's of interest to me. Now, Senator Lindsay,...

SENATOR HALL: Senator Lindsay.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: ...you're talking about entry into a vehicle without breaking in.

SENATOR LINDSAY: Right.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Okay, so the door could be standing open...

SENATOR LINDSAY: Right.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: ...and you could sit in the car.

SENATOR LINDSAY: Right.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: All right, now immediately above that...and maybe you and Senator Beutler discussed this, is unauthorized use of a propelled vehicle. That is a Class III misdemeanor.
