SENATOR LINDSAY: Well, it's kind of a...it can be answered either way. It depends on whether the dysfunctional family unit is one that can be rehabilitated or if it is one that cannot be. It depends on the particular circumstances. Sometimes, yes, sometimes no.

SENATOR SCHROCK: Okay. But it probably would be a fair statement to say that maybe Omaha is the best site for this facility, but we don't know so why not open it up to the whole state and let someone who has more expertise than we have decide?

SENATOR LINDSAY: No, I think that is an abrogation of our responsibility in the first place. Second place, I think we've determined it once last year. It's a question of not what area it should be in, the question now is just what particular line within that area ought to be.

SENATOR SCHROCK: Okay. Well, I'm not an expert on this subject. I have relayed Senator Lynch's message. If I have any extra time, if Senator Cudaback would like to use it he is more than free to so.

SENATOR BERNARD-STEVENS: Senator Cudaback, would you like the rest of Senator Schrock's time? It would be about two minutes.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Members, I will take Senator Chambers' advice here and he pointed out the fact that I probably should add that extra word in there and I'd like to place the period after the word established and then strike the rest of that sentence. So if the body would go along with that I'd be pleased.

SENATOR BERNARD-STEVENS: Yeah, without objection it will be modified and you now have a verb, Senator Cudaback.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Okay.

SENATOR BERNARD-STEVENS: You may...is there an objection? The Chair hears none. You may continue. You have about a minute and a half.
