

they have to offer. You're going to have them offer it, you'll have all the communities developing their plans, they're going to get all excited, they're going to be bidding against each other, Kearney is going to go against North Platte, North Platte against McCook, all of them against Scottsbluff and Alliance. You're going to have communities getting together, maybe the Grand Island, Hastings, Kearney area will get together on one. All of that will happen. And after they review all of the sites then we pick Omaha, because Senator Schrock and everyone else is saying, we know it's going to be in Omaha. But what you've done by the Cudaback amendment is you're going to set us back another year before we even can acquire the land and then it will be six to eight months before we get it going again. You've just doubled our time. And you've set us back again on juvenile justice, back to square one because we've...

PRESIDENT ROBAK: One minute.

SENATOR BERNARD-STEVENS: ...broken the link of the time frame that all things need to happen. Now, is it going to be a dire, crucial thing? We're going to all die on juvenile justice? No. If we don't reconsider, we'll find a way to do it. But it does hurt and it does nothing for what we're trying to do. It does set us back, it will cost us more and the debate of where it should be is...should have been in the past, and it should be in the future, but not now. It should have been when the amendment was agreed to last year, that's when the concern needed to be there, not now. And when and if we build the other 75-bed facility, it can be in the future where that's going to be located. But, for pete sake, let's get the one we have built. Senator Vrtiska was correct and incorrect in one degree. Yes, one of the sights is \$3 million, Floyd, you're absolutely right. We're not going to buy any land for \$3 million. The State of Nebraska has the right and the ability to go in,...

PRESIDENT ROBAK: Time.

SENATOR BERNARD-STEVENS: ...condemn land, take it, and I suspect that's what we may have to do.

PRESIDENT ROBAK: Thank you, Senator Bernard-Stevens. Senator Lindsay, to speak to the motion to reconsider.

SENATOR LINDSAY: Thank you, Madam President, members. I, too, rise in support of the reconsideration. I think...I think we
