SENATOR WITEK: Madam President, members of the body, I know this is an important issue and it's an important issue to me, too. And if it was an issue that was in a bill all by itself and we were talking about this issue alone on this floor and you were saying that there was a need, because of the \$3 million suggested price tag for the piece of land in Omaha, to possibly at least send a message or discuss having the opportunity for other areas, maybe just surrounding the metropolitan area, to make a bid on putting up the facility, I would be in there agreeing with you.
