SENATOR CROSBY: You're like my husband. Bob has that kind of voice that carries. But the idea that we will lose time on the time line in getting this facility built I think is very important, so for that reason I will change my vote. The second thing, Senator Coordsen mentioned it. It really does concern me and we've talked about this in Appropriations many times, and we had...I think we had Jon Hill in maybe three times, I'm not sure. And you know who that is, the man who is head of this juvenile project that's going forward. But it does concern me that it just comes down in Omaha to one place. There were other sites but I think there's some of the NIMBY mentality around and they're not sure they want it there. The mayor has come out for the place, if I understand correctly, out by the Omaha corrections, and maybe that's a logical place for it. I don't really care where it is. But yesterday...I haven't talked all day today, this is the first time I've spoken. I woke up several times last night and cried again. I cried a lot last night because all day yesterday, and I keep hearing you people say, we have to take care of these juveniles, we have to take care of these children. Think where you're going to put them. They're supposed to be near their families. Yesterday you didn't give one hoot about the children because you passed that ADC bill that I still say you would not even take off that nine month cap, you wouldn't do that. One vote was all we needed and you wouldn't do that. So I'm still feeling weepy for the children because all these babies do, their only sin and their only crime is that they're born. And a lot of them end up and will end up in this juvenile facility because the families have a hard time and the mothers are looked down upon, they're left out of the social circle because they don't have any money, they have a hard time getting their education, so these children,
