

you get anyway you've got to participate in some of these programs, yet the programs are not there. There are not enough to accommodate everybody. The drafters of that amendment felt they took care of the problem by saying the mere fact that the program is not there will not prevent a person from getting good time. But an inmate may say it is not the good time that I feel I'm cheated from. You are cheating me out of the opportunity to participate in this program and gain what I can gain from the program. If the state is going to put it there and make it available, they have to make it available to all the inmates who want to participate. Otherwise, you make it possible for there to be favoritism and discriminatory granting of the privilege of attending these courses and participating in these programs. And if the programs are to have substance, then they're going to be something of value. And if I were an inmate, I'd just be getting my little pencil and pen ready right now and they're entitled to do that because we, the Legislature, with the means to provide enough money to fund what we say is our intent and we refuse to do it, then we create a cause of action. We have to provide public education. And if we don't, then the citizens have a right to seek a judicial remedy for that. There are laws which bind even the Legislature, Senator Coordsen, and sometimes I, in the same way that others, am constricted by these laws and restricted in a way which on occasion I wish would not be the case. My motion to bracket the bill gives us the opportunity to...looks like Senator Cudaback has something in his hand that you usually get when you have not followed the restrictions of the law and they give you a little reminder of the fact that what you have done is outside the law. Senator Cudaback, I collect more of them than you do. I don't need yours. I'll give you some of mine if you want them. But at any rate, this would give us a chance to move on to other things. And I don't see another item on the agenda which rubs me the way that this crime bill used to rub me. But there are so many land mines in this that I don't even care if it's passed. And I will call attention to some of the things in it to some of the people who may have an interest, especially this thing where on entering a motor vehicle, unauthorized entry of the vehicle, if you enter the vehicle, Senator Coordsen, with the intent to commit a misdemeanor, be aware that that is a Class IV felony so what you have got to do is then drive the car away. Because if you drive it away without the owner's consent, then you're guilty of unauthorized use of the vehicle and that's a misdemeanor. If you just sit there with the intent to take it and you don't take it, that's a Class IV felony because it's unauthorized entry
