SENATOR CHAMBERS: ...to let him withdraw the amendment because he couldn't have withdrawn it without your support. You all had to be in the frame of mind to feel like you are stomping the holy daylights out of Ernie Chambers by letting him withdraw his amendment. I think he voted to keep that facility in the Omaha area and if you check the voting list you'll see it. This is more fun than playing checkers, at least it is for me. Senator Crosby said almost anything is more fun than playing checkers. With that, I'll let it go at this point and turn my light on.
