

SENATOR BROMM: How much time would you think it would take to determine whether or not some of these sections could be changed as far as the operative date? If we were to...can that be worked on between now and Final Reading perhaps or?

SENATOR LINDSAY: Well, I don't know between now and Final Reading, I'm looking to see because I have been looking to see which ones are the ones that I think might need that fine tuning or need some additional work. And to answer your question, by the way, I think July 1 of '96 gets us past the next session so that any problems we come up with can be addressed in the next session and take effect prior to their operative dates.

PRESIDENT ROBAK: One minute.

SENATOR LINDSAY: But I've been looking at some of the sections. You hit on a couple of them. Senator Beutler hit on a couple in the penalty provisions that frankly were in the amendment I initially offered, at least raised, opened those sections up that I thought needed some discussion. And the penalty provisions that Senator Beutler talks about, it may be something that reflects the will of this body and it may not be. Some of those ought to be looked at and the body may say we ought to hang on to those. Those are appropriate, a ID felony in this case is appropriate under these circumstances. The body may not see that, but that's...those would be the primary things I would think, the good time, motor vehicle, to make sure if there's something that needs to be done and then those...
