

not have deceived anybody. Senator Bohlke, when we worked together we were very blunt and direct with each other on that welfare bill on where each of us stood and I want to make it as clear in this instance as I possibly can. I will do everything I can, even if this bill is delayed until tomorrow, to stop it from going anywhere if the only thing that will be attempted is to change some operative dates so the unconstitutional provisions can stay in there and maybe we'll deal with them next year and the Governor can then trumpet about what a great bill he's got and we will have put some trash in the law that we know is trash at the time we put it there. And I wanted to mention specific things so the court will know we called attention to it and the Legislature chose to leave it in there. It was not by happenstance. It was not through oversight. It was not inadvertence. To the court, I address them. Honorable members of the court, we know what we are doing. We intend to do it. We steadfastly refuse to remove any of these bad provisions from this bill. Now it's there. I don't want our debate to be ambiguous or vague. This bill is so serious...

PRESIDENT ROBAK: One minute.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: ...that those of you who say you want to fight crime should feel the way the rest of us feel and I don't like the bill. But it is such a conglomeration of preposterous provisions that it's an embarrassment to the Legislature. There are members who've come to me and acknowledged that they're not lawyers but they see the problems. So you know with the public, some of them will be glad because they'll say, well, they got a crime bill, crime's going to be over this time next year. This is a bad bill and maybe I ought to do the right thing and withdraw this motion, so that if somebody wants to try to bracket it to a lesser...I meant not as far in the future, then they could do it. But that old devil just gets inside me sometimes and remember this, if Senator Lindsay does not invoke cloture, it can come back on the agenda whether there is a bracket motion adopted or not.

PRESIDENT ROBAK: Time. Thank you, Senator Chambers. Question before the body is the adoption of the bracket motion to LB 371. All those in favor vote aye; all those opposed vote nay.
