

machine itself, you take the cassette. That's theft.

PRESIDENT ROBAK: One minute.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: That's a misdemeanor. That is a Class IV felony, but if instead of just taking the cassette you take the whole car, that's not a Class IV felony. Taking the car itself is a misdemeanor. Reaching through the window and taking the cassette is a felony. Now wouldn't you rather have it reversed so that if this person did know the law they'd say, well, I'm just going to take the cassette because that's all that I really want, but the way it is now they're better off if they take your whole car. I think even Senator Witek is beginning to understand that now. Water has to drip continually before it makes an impression on some things, but since the Colorado River can cut through that stone and create the Grand Canyon, if my words as a continual dropping hit Senator Witek's mind eventually something is going to get through, and they're working on that now.

PRESIDENT ROBAK: Thank you, Senator Chambers. Senator Brown.

SENATOR BROWN: Madam President and members, not all of us are getting in the mood around this particular amendment and I rise to oppose the Chambers amendment and what I consider the demeaning attitude that it demonstrates towards the seriousness of Senator Landis's amendment. Rape is serious crime. It is mostly against women, and I think in our discussion of this and our discussion of things like Hammond organs, we should remember the number of women who die as a result of trying to resist a rapist. And we're not talking about protecting rapists from additional penalties. We are talking about what constitutes rape and what a woman, usually a woman, must do to demonstrate that she has been raped. Thank you.

SENATOR HALL: On the underlying amendment.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Madam President and members of the Legislature, what we're talking about here is consent. We're talking about how you can establish that consent was not given, not just the act, but some people, as Senator Landis I think
