SPEAKER WITHEM: Senator Lindsay, I guess, because of all the extra pay that the Speaker gets for holding this position, it's because of the tough decisions that need to be made, reluctantly, I am going to have to say that the addition of the operative date to the Landis amendment and then adding the remainder of the amendment, matters that are not related to the issue of...of sexual assault would not be sufficient, in my mind, to make the amendment germane. I'm going to have to rule that it is not germane.

SENATOR LINDSAY: I would move to overrule the Chair.

SPEAKER WITHEM: You are recognized to open on the motion.

SENATOR LINDSAY: It is...we've had a couple of...thank you, Mr. Speaker, members, we had a couple of rulings today on germaneness and they've gone, I think, as Senator Beutler mentioned earlier, they've gone to the extremes and it depends, obviously, who is...probably should have put Senator Hall in the Chair, depends on who is, oftentimes, who is in the Chair. Senator Withem has adopted a very strict, and consistently, a very strict method of...or interpretation of the germaneness rule, others have adopted more broad...others, for example, Senator Chambers, have adopted more broad interpretations of the germaneness rule. And this is a...this would be a, certainly, a broad interpretation but I think it's an interpretation that can...can withstand. I would urge that the Chair be overruled.

SPEAKER WITHEM: The question before the body is, shall the Chair be overruled? There are several lights on. Let me, and members have an opportunity to speak one time and one time only. We have Senator Landis. Will you be speaking on the motion to overrule?

SENATOR LANDIS: Very briefly.

SPEAKER WITHEM: Senator Chambers. Senator Wesely, on the motion to overrule. Senator Maurstad, on the motion to overrule. Senator Will, on the motion to overrule. Senator Dierks, on the motion to overrule. So, so far, we've had Maurstad and Dierks who will not. Senator Coordsen, on the motion to overrule. Senator Bohlke, on the motion to overrule.
