

SENATOR BROMM: And the delay date is until when?

SENATOR WESELY: I think July 1 of next year.

SENATOR BROMM: Of 1996.

SENATOR WESELY: Right.

SENATOR BROMM: Okay. Thank you very much.

SENATOR WESELY: Thank you.

PRESIDENT ROBAK: Thank you, Senator Bromm. Senator Stuhr.

SENATOR STUHR: Madam President and members of the Legislature, I have a couple of questions I would like to address to Senator Wesely.

PRESIDENT ROBAK: Senator Wesely.

SENATOR STUHR: On this one section when you were talking about definitions, could you, on page 17, line 21, is this what you are referring to is competent, that term "competent individuals"?

SENATOR WESELY: No, that...that is the one that Senator Schrock put in there, and that...that's not in contest right now. What is in contest is the question of delegation versus direction by LPNs, and the actual language in the bill we think is probably fine. It is the question again of how is the Health Department going to carry that out, and that's what we want to see with the rules and regs before we actually put it into effect.

SENATOR STUHR: I guess I had some concerns, my nursing home had some concerns about that term "competent individuals", as it related to page 17, line 21, you know, and who they were, and because they must require training, you know, in the nursing home, and we just didn't think that was well defined.

SENATOR WESELY: I, because I don't have it right in front of me, I am guessing as to which particular point you are making, but it may, in fact, still be covered. So...
