SENATOR LINDSAY PRESIDING

SENATOR LINDSAY: Thank you, Senator Coordsen. Senator Robinson, to the Withem amendment. Senator Robinson waives off. Senator Withem, no further lights, would you care to close?

SPEAKER WITHEM: Just simply this language removes the cost per pupil language which was one of the technical concerns that Senator Wickersham had, and I agree that it probably doesn't need to be there. And if it makes the bill function a little more smoothly we'll go that way.

SENATOR LINDSAY: You've heard the closing. The question is, shall the Withem amendment to the Bohlke amendment be adopted? All in favor vote aye; those opposed vote nay. Record, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 27 ayes, 0 nays, Madam Pres...Mr. President, excuse me, on the adoption of Senator Withem's amendment to the Bohlke amendment.

SENATOR LINDSAY: The amendment is adopted. Next item, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: Senator Chambers would move to amend. (Chambers amendment, FA311, appears on page 2577 of the Legislative Journal.)

SENATOR LINDSAY: Senator Chambers, to open on your amendment.
