

an assurance that the...that such local educational agency is in compliance with the state law required by subsection (d) above; and a description of the circumstances surrounding any expulsions imposed under the state law required by subsection (d), that's the main body of the prohibition; the name of the school concerned, the number of students expelled from such school; and (c) the type of weapons concerned. Each state shall report that information then in turn to the secretary...the federal secretary on an annual basis. So all these other details that will result in districts not getting money if they don't do it, we've put into our statute. But the one detail upon also which their getting money is contingent is not put in, and that's the referral requirement. And I wanted to be sure that notwithstanding the fact that we didn't require it in statute that the board of education, I mean if I'm going to pull this amendment, then we should be clear that the board of education, we're counting on them to take care of this.

SENATOR ABOUD: Is there any type of requirement then that they have to provide this information to...in our statute to require the board of education to provide that this information be provided to the Department of Education?

SENATOR BEUTLER: I think I would refer to Senator Bohlke and the Education Committee counsel on that. To my knowledge there is no requirement, except what requirement the Department of Education presumably would set up pursuant...as a requirement for getting a distribution of funds from the Department of Educa...from the State Department of Education.

SENATOR ABOUD: Thank you, Senator Beutler. Senator Bohlke, would you respond to that. Have you been listening to our dialogue in regard to...you're right behind me, I hope you've been listening to me.

SENATOR BOHLKE: Pardon, pardon me. With one ear.

SENATOR ABOUD: Okay. The question is, the requirement that this information that's stated in your amendment, on the last page 8, has to provided to the federal government as well. Is that also a part of the bill?

SENATOR BOHLKE: Yes.

SENATOR ABOUD: Where is that in the bill?
