SENATOR HALL: Thank you, Senator Bernard-Stevens. There were a number of lights on prior to this amendment. Senator Abboud, did you care to speak to the Bernard-Stevens amendment?

SENATOR ABOUD: I'll speak to the...

SENATOR HALL: Thank you. Senator Bernard-Stevens, your light is on again. Senator Beutler, to the Bernard-Stevens amendment? Thank you. Senator Warner, to the Bernard-Stevens amendment.

SENATOR WARNER: Mr. President, briefly, I was just going to rise to support it. I...as I recall, I used to be accused from time to time of people thinking if you told the chairman, you told the Legislature, and I certainly don't want to put Senator Wehrbein in that position. So I would think it would be a good idea to include the Legislative Fiscal Office as a whole.

SENATOR HALL: Thank you, Senator Warner. There are no lights. Senator Bernard-Stevens to close. He waives closing. The question is the adoption of the Bernard-Stevens amendment. All in favor vote aye. Opposed nay. Have you all voted? We're voting on the Bernard-Stevens amendment to the Warner amendment. Senator Bernard-Stevens.

SENATOR BERNARD-STEVENS: Why don't we go under call. I'll accept call-in votes.

SENATOR HALL: Thank you very much. The question is, shall the house go under call? All those in favor vote aye, opposed nay. Record, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 16 ayes, 0 nays to go under call, Mr. President.

SENATOR HALL: Thank you, Mr. Clerk. The house is under call. All members please return to the Chamber and record their presence. The house is under call. Senator Bernard-Stevens has requested or authorized call-in votes.

CLERK: Senator Beutler voting yes. Senator Kristensen voting yes.
