There was no opposition to it. It came out in very good shape but Senator Warner found a way even to improve the bill and the shall is more onto may so it's reversed it a little bit on may approve, so the burden is changed a little from disapprove, which I concur with. The only question I wanted to ask Senator Warner, it still has, and I just didn't read it carefully enough on that first part, it still exempts the University of Nebraska, does it not?

SENATOR HALL: Senator Warner.

SENATOR WARNER: Well, the university, state colleges and the other constitutional offices...

SENATOR WARNER: ...that constitutionally we have to do, yes.
