SENATOR WILL: Senator Brashear, Senator Chambers, would you please approach the Clerk and work on the amendment. In the meantime, Senator Schimek, you are recognized. Senator Schimek, your light is next.

SENATOR SCHIMEK: Thank you, Mr. President, and members of the body, I don't know if I still want the time or not but while they're doing that, I would...what I turned my light on about, I was just kind of curious as to how many boards, commissions, agencies and so forth are actually established by the Constitution. And I've just...I've been having a little side conversation here with Senator Kristensen and I guess I will just ask him off the top of his head to talk about that a little bit, because there...

SENATOR WILL: Senator Kristensen, will you respond?

SENATOR SCHIMEK: ...really aren't that many, are there, Senator Kristensen? I...I'm putting you on the spot.

SENATOR KRISTENSEN: Don't be offended here, I was busy doing something else and the question is...

SENATOR SCHIMEK: Just basically, you know, in this amendment we're talking about agencies established by the Constitution and you've named a few for me. There really aren't that many.

SENATOR KRISTENSEN: Oh, no, I don't think there's very many set in the Constitution, I mean, you're probably talking about...if you count the Parole Board as a commission, I don't know, whether you do. The Postsecondary Coordinating Commission, the Public Service Commission comes to mind. There's a...you're catching me a little cold.

SENATOR SCHIMEK: Well, it's not fair, but I mean,...

SENATOR KRISTENSEN: It's just off the top of my head...

SENATOR SCHIMEK: Yeah.

SENATOR KRISTENSEN: ...but I don't...aren't that many. I...I...the Tax Commissioner really isn't a commissioner but is named in the Constitution as a commissioner.
