

SENATOR JANSSEN: Now, could you answer this question for me? Are there any private so-called blinds off of the...off of the controlled area that are within that distance from the reserve that you know of?

SENATOR HUDKINS: Within the 110 yards?

SENATOR JANSSEN: Right.

SENATOR HUDKINS: No, because that is against the law.

SENATOR JANSSEN: No.

SENATOR HUDKINS: You cannot have a blind within that area.

SENATOR JANSSEN: I mean outside the 110 yards or right at the 110 yards.

SENATOR HUDKINS: Private blinds?

SENATOR JANSSEN: Right.

SENATOR HUDKINS: I'm assuming that if it's on private land, there are going to be private blinds.

SENATOR JANSSEN: Uh-huh. And there's no control over them then, is there, as long as they stay outside of that buffer zone?

SENATOR HUDKINS: But the Game and Parks Commission would still be receiving the complaints because it has to do with the geese and the ducks.

SENATOR JANSSEN: Uh-huh. Now you realize that...and I'm sure you do, that the game reserve between Rogers, Nebraska, and the Douglas County line, that's a long way, there's a lot of reserve on the Platte River there, and there are a lot of migratory birds that do congregate there during migration season. And how long...how long has this controlled shooting area been in the Valley area? Do you know, for how many years?

SENATOR HUDKINS: Our knowledge says the mid-eighties, early eighties, perhaps.

SENATOR JANSSEN: Okay, thank you. Now would they be affected,
