

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Senator Schrock, does this bill make no distinction between violations, the seriousness of a violation?

SENATOR SCHROCK: Well, I assume at the present time it doesn't, and the present amendment, I assume, doesn't. But at the present time if you have two violations the Game and Parks may revoke your license to operate, it doesn't say shall. And if this amendment passes then it shall...then it will say they shall revoke your license, in other words, they don't have any choice, they can't use any judgment on this issue as to whether this controlled shooting area should continue to operate.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Senator Schrock, if you look at the top line, line number 1 on page 35, it talks about misrepresentation in obtaining the license. That doesn't have to do with a typographical or a spelling error, a misrepresentation is a deliberate act. So you want people to be able to misrepresent and still keep their license? Yes, go ahead, take your time.

SENATOR SCHROCK: It also says at the bottom of page 34, if they are found guilty of any violation of any provisions of the section. So it doesn't necessarily have to mean misrepresentation. I assume if it did mean...misrepresent the issue then they would revoke their license.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: What...what is the type of violation that would be found in 37-901, because there is a reference back to that?

SENATOR SCHROCK: I can't answer that.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Okay...I'm...okay, I think it might be in the bill, starting on page 25. You're going to say that all of this language that Senator Hudkins put in here to reassure everybody about how this thing is to operate, you want them to be able to violate that provision and not lose their license, so it just about gives them carte blanche' to do what they want to, doesn't it? It could. I mean.... I'm asking you, Senator Schrock, for your opinion.

SENATOR SCHROCK: Well, my response would be that when issuing licenses or revoking licenses good judgment should be used. And I think the words may be certainly more appropriate than the words shall. And the seriousness of the violation should determine as to whether their controlled shooting license should
