

adoption of the Dierks amendment. All those in favor vote aye, opposed vote nay. Members, have you all voted? I guess it appears as though you have. Would you record, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 27 ayes, 0 nays on adoption of Senator Dierks' amendment.

SPEAKER WITHEM: The Dierks amendment is adopted. Mr. Clerk, next item.

SPEAKER WITHEM: Senator Preister.

SENATOR PREISTER: Thank you, Honorable President, friends all. I introduced this amendment as again a compromise from what we were working with on the General File amendments. At that time I had introduced the amendment that took into account the property owners within a ten-mile radius of the area. After some discussion I withdrew that amendment to work on something that would be better to deal with the idea of how we make the licenses available to people and the process by which those people who are most immediately going to be affected are taken into account. AM2409 has sections in it that deal with public interest. It, in effect, gives a definition of what that would be and it states that in determining whether or not the...and it is in the Journal, so if anyone did want to look at it for themselves, you can see that it's on Journal page 2427. But it basically gives some support to the fact that people in the immediate area are going to be impacted by the licensing of a controlled shooting area. And I don't think there would be much dispute that to have large numbers of trafficking going on with guns into the area, with people coming into the area, the additional traffic, the additional shooting, that there's going to be an impact and that those neighbors are going to feel that impact and that they should have some additional consideration given to them. The amendment states that in determining whether or not the issuance of the license is in the public interest, the commission shall find at a minimum that the establishment of a controlled shooting area will not create a threat of harm to adjoining landowners and their property, will not interfere with adjoining landowners' quiet enjoyment of their property, and will not interfere with future development and expansion. This
