SENATOR BERNARD-STEVENS: Thank you, Senator Schrock. Senator Beutler, you have about one minute, ten seconds left.

SENATOR BEUTLER: I think that was all the time I needed, Mister... Senator Bernard-Stevens. Thank you.

SENATOR BERNARD-STEVENS: Thank you, Senator Beutler. Senator Schrock. Excuse me. Senator Preister, did you want to seek recognition at this time?

SENATOR PREISTER: Yes, I did. Thank you, Honorable President and friends all. I would ask that the current amendment be substituted for one that I just gave to the Clerk that has a designation of 1-A on the corner. It's actually on two pages but it's all one amendment. If I...

SENATOR BERNARD-STEVENS: Senator Preister, if I have it right, you're asking unanimous consent to substitute 1-A that's two-pages long for 2409. Is that correct?

SENATOR PREISTER: That is correct.

SENATOR BERNARD-STEVENS: Is there an objection to the substitution? The Chair not hearing objection, it's so ordered. Senator Preister, you're recognized. I assume it's your amendment. You're recognized to open on the amendment. (Senator Preister's FA323 is found on page 2614 of the Legislative Journal.)

SENATOR PREISTER: Thank you, Honorable President, friends all. Yes, it is a combination of effort on a number of people's parts to come to a compromise on what we're attempting to do here. The one section of it would allow for the one-mile buffer zone between controlled shooting areas and existing wildlife refuges and that would be for future controlled shooting areas. It really wouldn't have an effect on ones that are in existence today because it would have an operative date of January 1, 1996. So those areas that were applying for licenses after that date would, at that time, have to be in compliance. I would prefer to see that in existence currently, but that is the way the amendment reads as part of the effort of compromise and I
