SENATOR BERNARD-STEVENS: Time, Senator.

SENATOR PREISTER: ..to do that. Thank you.

SENATOR BERNARD-STEVENS: Thank you, Senator Preister. Senator Jones.

SENATOR JONES: Mr. President and members of the body, a lot of the amendments that Senator Preister brought up that I couldn't support this morning, but with the compromise that's been put...worked together by several of the senators I can support it now so I just wanted to make that comment so thank you.

SENATOR BERNARD-STEVENS: Thank you, Senator Jones. Senator Preister, there are no other lights. I'll recognize you to close.

SENATOR PREISTER: Thank you, Honorable President, friends all. I would conclude by saying that I would ask for your support on this amendment. I think that will be easier to do than some of the other amendments that I have proposed. I would just continue with my dialog in terms of the substantial threat. I think, yes, pellets that would be hitting a house would be a danger, but certainly children that would be playing in a yard would be at risk. I think that would constitute a substantial threat. The livestock that would be on somebody's property would constitute a substantial threat. I think that there are areas that Game and Parks can look at when they're looking at issuing a license that put substantial threat in a perspective that allows them to make some decisions based on the best interest to include those people who are in the immediate area and adjoining the potential or proposed controlled shooting area, including school buses that would drive by, and this particular property is right on a highway so we're looking at safety issues here and, although we don't spell those things out specifically, that's what the intent is here that we're talking about when we're talking about dealing with public interest, the interest of those people who are most directly going to be impacted--the children on the school buses, the children who are waiting for those school buses, the cars that are traveling by on the highway, the people in those vehicles, the livestock
