

that's in the immediate area, the impact that it would have on those folks that are most directly going to be impacted. And since we don't spell that out, I hope that this record and this dialog will give Game and Parks some direction that they may not have in the specific language of the actual amendment. I think the interference with adjoining landowners' enjoyment of their property is also an aspect of it that I hope they take into account and that these are all things when they have the public hearing before the licensure that they will listen very closely to, because we did amend this bill to put in a public hearing and I recognize that that may be a challenge for them but it certainly is a part of this process and allowing people to have their voices heard and allowing those people to be taken into account before licenses are issued. And even though we have inserted substantial threat of harm to adjoining landowners, that they need to look at that substantial threat of harm in a broad way and that that's only a part of what they look at in terms of how they grant those licenses; that they need to continue not to limit it to only these two aspects but to the same range of considerations that they have been giving their consideration to prior to licensure. This is to spell out and to give additional emphasis to these adjoining property owners, but in no way is it intended to limit it to just that, but that this is a part of that and not exclusively so. And, with that, I would just conclude by saying I appreciate everyone's help in working on this and I particularly continue to be concerned about those people who live in this immediate area. Thank you very much.
