So my point with this amendment is if your concern is with the Legislature and your concern is with this one incident that you keep bringing up, and you've given us no other areas of concern, no one has come to me telling me that this is a problem anywhere else in state government, then why should we as the Legislature put into state law a bill that covers the entire state government because of one incident that happened in the Legislature? To me that just isn't the way that we should make laws, and I do still have very serious concerns about this. I would ask, I guess, for a call of the house since it's dinner time, and ask that we have a call of the house and a roll call vote on this amendment to exempt out everything except the Legislature out of this bill. Thank you.

SPEAKER WITHEM: Question before the body is, shall the house go under call? All those in favor vote aye, opposed vote nay. Record, Mr. Clerk.
