

SENATOR SCHELLPEPER: That's about the average, yes.

SENATOR BEUTLER: Okay, but there is variation depending upon (interruption)...

SENATOR SCHELLPEPER: There is variation according to...

SENATOR BEUTLER: ...the way it is structured in the individual case?

SENATOR SCHELLPEPER: ...what type pickles and different type groups that have them, yes.

SENATOR BEUTLER: Okay. And then with respect to the bingo expense, that goes from 12 to 14 percent. In that case, what percentages are coming down? Who bears that cost?

SENATOR SCHELLPEPER: That'd be the same way. It would be divided between the three groups, the charities, and the cities, and the payback, but it would be very little on the actual payback, mainly on the other two.

SENATOR BEUTLER: Okay, and that would be determined by who?

SENATOR SCHELLPEPER: The people that are the operators also.

SENATOR BEUTLER: The operators, and, generally speaking, what is the payback on bingo right now?

SENATOR SCHELLPEPER: I...Senator Will, maybe he could answer it, the payback on bingo.

PRESIDENT ROBAK: Senator Will.

SENATOR WILL: If I recall correctly, the payback on bingo is in the range of 75 percent.

SENATOR BEUTLER: In the range of 75 percent. Okay, thank you very much, Senator Schellpeper.

PRESIDENT ROBAK: Thank you, Senator Beutler. Senator Wesely.
