PRESIDENT ROBAK: Senator Schellpeper.

SENATOR SCHELLPEPER: It depends on how much is bet, and I don't know how much each city has, so...

SENATOR WESELY: But over all the state, we have...

SENATOR SCHELLPEPER: The whole state?

SENATOR WESELY: I mean is this just...this covers the whole state.

SENATOR SCHELLPEPER: There were 24 million wagered on bingo last year.

SENATOR WESELY: Twenty-four million?

SENATOR SCHELLPEPER: Yes, last year.

SENATOR WESELY: Okay, and then pickle cards are...

SENATOR SCHELLPEPER: And pickles are 175, 176 million.

SENATOR WESELY: Okay. Well, you are talking about, well, that's a pretty significant amount, and 175 million, that'd be...that'd be over a million dollars. I'm going to try to take a look at this, not having had time to review it. The only thing, I understand that these were all in bills that came out of committee?

SENATOR SCHELLPEPER: Yes. Well, in fact, they are all amendments and bills, and they've all been agreed to, Senator, by the cities, the keno operators, the pickle operators, the bingo places, there has been no opposition.

SENATOR WESELY: Is that right?

SENATOR SCHELLPEPER: Everybody has agreed that it is something that has to happen,...
