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members of the body. Usually I have a good feel of the body of what to do or what not to do. I must be honest with you, I don't have a good feel of the body, so I'll find out very shortly in this particular case. In the crime bill that we had last week, and will be up, I suspect tomorrow morning for a couple of hours, there was a section that I think was important. We had a round of...strong round of debate. Senator Cudaback had an amendment we had to reconsider. We did reconsider. The language was kept the same, but then when Senator Lindsay pulled the amendment, we were left right where we...where we started, and that was on a secure facility. What I'm not...I'm...if I were comfortable that the adult crime bill would pass tomorrow, and then later pass Final Reading along with the A bill, I wouldn't even consider doing this, but I am not comfortable with that, and it is a change that we need to make, and that change simply is the way that it was, that it came out in the amendment yesterday that reaffirms what the Legislature decided to do, and that would be that the secure facility would be located in a county which a city of a metropolitan class resides, which would, in essence, be Douglas County. A couple of the sites that have been given...or one site, in particular, that is given to us for a potential look is partially within Omaha, partially without in Omaha. That would give them the flexibility to locate that site in the Omaha area. I would like to suspend the rules to get this issue taken care of so we don't run into the problem that we talked about the other evening, and would see what the body's will is on this point.

PRESIDENT ROBAK: Thank you, Senator Bernard-Stevens. Senator Will.

SENATOR WILL: Thank you, Madam President, members of the body. I rise in support of the motion to suspend the rules. I think this is an issue that we need to deal with. I would like to see it dealt with on this bill. I think certainly there is ample argument that can be made for doing exactly what Senator Bernard-Stevens has explained, giving some flexibility while keeping the facility in the Omaha metropolitan area, and I would hope that we could do that. I think the arguments were thoroughly aired last week when we considered this proposition, and I would hope that the body would move to suspend the rules at this point.
