CLERK: (Read LB 20 on Final Reading.)

PRESIDENT ROBAK: All provisions of law relative to procedure having been complied with, the question is, shall LB 20 pass? All those in favor vote aye, all those opposed vote nay. Please record.

CLERK: (Read record vote. See page 2629 of the Legislative Journal.) 31 ayes, 6 nays, 11 present and not voting, 1 excused and not voting.

PRESIDENT ROBAK: LB 20 passes. LB 20A.

CLERK: (Read LB 20A on Final Reading.)

PRESIDENT ROBAK: All provisions of law relative to procedure having been complied with, the question is, shall LB 20A pass? All those in favor vote aye, all those opposed vote nay. Please record.

CLERK: (Read record vote. See page 2630 of the Legislative Journal.) 36 ayes, 1 nay, 11 present and not voting, 1 excused and not voting.

PRESIDENT ROBAK: LB 20A passes. LB 25.

CLERK: Senator Hall would move to return the bill.

PRESIDENT ROBAK: The Chair recognizes Senator Hall to open on his motion.

SENATOR HALL: Thank you, Madam President and members. I do this so that I can get a question answered by Senator Crosby, and I have talked to her about it. The motion is one where I would like to get something into the record, and I apologize that the...but the bill was advanced over to Select File, from Select File to Final Reading before. It is not an attempt to amend but merely to try to ask a question to clarify, and if Senator Crosby would respond, I rise in support of the bill. It does this, it says that...the idea behind the bill is to allow for the delivery of direct mental health, alcoholism, and drug abuse services to individuals who are hearing-impaired persons with mental health, alcoholism, and drug abuse disorders. The concept is found on page 4, and it is in Section 4, lines 16
