PRESIDENT ROBAK: Senator Bernard-Stevens.

SENATOR BERNARD-STEVENS: Madam President, I suspect people want to wait on the divisions. May I suggest that we stand at ease until the divisions are determined.

PRESIDENT ROBAK: Thank you, Senator. The body is at ease.

PRESIDENT ROBAK: The Lindsay amendment has been divided. It will be divided into seven sections as follows. The first division will be all of page 1, page 2 and through line 7 on page 3. So the first division is all of page 1, page 2 and through line 7 on page 3. The second division will be the second sentence of Section 32 on page 3. The second division will be the second sentence of Section 32 on page 3 that begins Sections 19 to 21 and ends on July 1, 1996. The third division begins with line 8 on page 3, through line 22 on page 3, picks up again on page...number line 27 on page 3, through line 7 on page 4. So the third section again is lines 8 through 22, minus the second sentence, line 27 on page 3, through line 7 on page 4. The fourth division is line 23. The fifth division is line 24. The sixth division is lines 25 and 26, all on page 3. And the seventh division are lines 8 through 14 on page 4. We will go...according to Senator Lindsay, we will go in the order of division starting with the first section. Senator Lindsay, to open on the first section of his amendment.

SENATOR LINDSAY: Thank you, Madam President, and members, just taking them in the order that they've...to try to avoid any confusion, just taking them in the order that the President has announced the divisions. Copies are being made right now. I just marked up a copy. They're being made of the Journal page where this was printed and they will be, hopefully, on your desks within three or four minutes. For purposes of discussion right now, we are dealing with Journal page 2553, 2554 and the first seven lines of Journal page 2555. What this section does, there's a lot of language to it, but the only...the operative change is simply...and we've discussed this once before, the change is that this would move the secure youth facility from within the corporate city limits of Omaha to within a county having a city of the metropolitan class which would be Douglas
