PRESIDENT ROBAK: One minute.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: ...in a corner because it's not a subject that even the members of the Legislature have thought deeply about. The only way this bill got a priority status is because Senator Withem prioritized it at the tail end of the period during which we could select priority bills. Otherwise, nobody wanted it. Senator Lindsay, who had his name on it, didn't want it. None of the people who cosponsored the bill wanted it and nobody wants it now, but since it's a political matter it has to come before us and, by carrying on the way that I am, I am, in a manner, showing my opposition to it and my contempt for this entire process and procedure. But since it's upon us I must participate and do my part.

PRESIDENT ROBAK: Thank you, Senator Chambers. Senator Hall. Senator Chambers.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Thank you, Madam President. Thank you, Senator Hall, and maybe one or two more times and then I'll be through on this particular motion because there are other fish to fry and there will be the opportunity to do so. When you took the other vote and said that this facility should be placed in Douglas County, I don't know whether that, by itself, is going to make any more land available at a better price. But if it does then maybe the vote that you took will have achieved something of value. If it does not then you could say, what difference did it make. It may not have helped but it didn't harm, we're still situated as we were before but we're no worse off, but you might be. But I won't go into all of that. Here is why I think this bill is very, very bad for the Legislature. We let forces outside of this body give us something of which they, themselves, are ashamed. The Governor will not, at any point, try to explain what is in this bill. Senator Lindsay has to acknowledge that his amendment is designed to change some of the problems that were in this bill from the beginning. The Judiciary Committee, the first time around, I think, may have stripped out some things that were even worse than what is before you now. If there were any professional pride in this body, and obviously there is not, except I have it, and I separate myself from the rest of the Legislature by doing as I
