

PRESIDENT ROBAK: Senator Chambers, to open on your motion.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Madam President, members of the Legislature, this would be on page 4, and we are dealing in the paragraph that would be comprehended in lines 2 through 10, and what this does is shift a judge. The current language would say that...well, if you read it, you will see the new language which shows where a change is being made and the stricken language will show you where the former situation has been altered. So the second district you will find mentioned in line 5, and that language says in the second and fifth district. The second district was not in this group before, and in this group in which the second district will be placed, there will be four judges. Now if you go to line 7, the second district is removed from this group where there were three judges. So now this shifting of the judges, of the judge creates a new set of circumstances. And if Senator Wickersham is here, I am going to ask him a question. Senator Wickersham,...

SENATOR CHAMBERS: ...what is the significance of this change that is being made by LB 189 in the form that we find it?

SENATOR WICKERSHAM: Senator, give me a moment.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Oh, that's all right, sure.

SENATOR WICKERSHAM: Maybe you would like to tell our colleagues, and then I will see if I agree with you.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Say it again. Say it again, Dad. Do you mind if I'd ask Senator Beutler...oh, go ahead, did you find we are on page 4?

SENATOR WICKERSHAM: I am trying to catch up with you.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Okay.

SENATOR WICKERSHAM: I was suggesting that maybe you wanted to tell the members, and then we would see if we agree with you.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Well, I just told them what it does. In the second and fifth districts, there will be four judges, which was
