CLERK: (Read roll call vote. See page 2676 of the Legislative Journal.) 13 ayes, 22 nays on the motion to return.

PRESIDENT ROBAK: The motion to return to Select File fails. Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: May I read some items, Madam President?

PRESIDENT ROBAK: Items for the record.

CLERK: Explanation of vote from Senator Stuhr. Bills read on Final Reading earlier have been presented to the Governor. (Re: LB 574, LB 19, LB 19A, LB 376, LB 377, LB 377A, LB 430, LB 494.) Enrollment and Review reports LB 189, LB 371 correctly engrossed. Senator Bernard-Stevens offers a motion with respect to LB 392, Senator Lindsay amendments to LB 765. (See pages 2676-79 of the Legislative Journal.)

Priority motion, Senator Wesely would move to reconsider the vote just taken on LB 626.

PRESIDENT ROBAK: Chair recognizes Senator Wesely to open on the motion to reconsider.

SENATOR WESELY: Thank you, Madam President, members, there's now 45 of us sitting here. There were probably about 12 or so of us here earlier as we discussed this amendment and I can understand because I was one of those not particularly paying attention. I was one of those that voted for the bill out of the Banking Committee, thought it sounded fine, but I think Senator Beutler has made some, I think, very strong arguments in favor of this. If we are going to proceed with some sort of legislation like this, this gives us a chance to look at it. If you could just look at the amendment, if you had a chance. What page is the amendment on, Mr. Clerk, if you get a chance.
