PRESIDENT ROBAK: All provisions of law relative to procedure having been complied with, the question is, shall LB 563A pass? All those in favor vote aye; all those opposed vote nay. Please record.

CLERK: (Read record vote. See pages 2728-29 of the Legislative Journal.) 44 ayes, 0 nays, 4 present and not voting, 1 excused and not voting.

PRESIDENT ROBAK: LB 563A passes. LB 658A. LB 860.

CLERK: Madam President, a series of motions. LB 860, Senator Bromm, with a priority motion, would move to bracket the bill until January 5, 1996.

PRESIDENT ROBAK: The Chair recognizes Senator Bromm to open on his motion to bracket.
