PRESIDENT ROBAK: One minute.

SENATOR WITEK: ...state. The way to do that would be to adopt the Robak amendment and allow those districts, and Millard will not get one penny of it, mind you, because we...all our schools will be hooked up by August. So this is not even my fight here, but the reason that I am so angry about it is because of the misunderstanding that is spewing from these individuals who are supporting this bill. Millard will not get one dime of it, but those individuals who have already invested in this, if they want to spend money on hardware, they can make the same kind of application for these grants that someone who hasn't spent one dime on it and they will be in there getting that money. It makes much more sense to adopt the Robak amendment and I'm sorry that it takes a bill off Final Reading. These are all things that should have been discussed at an earlier date, but obviously people have come, because it has been such a busy schedule, come a little late to the realization of the implications of this bill so we are discussing them now and it is a stage of debate. It's something that you need to consider. This isn't...
