PRESIDENT ROBAK: Thank you, Senator Robinson. Is there any further discussion on the Beutler motion? Senator Witek.

SENATOR WITEK: Madam Chairman, members of the body, if you're interested in property tax, some savings, this is definitely an amendment to vote for because this distribution of funds would be included in the state aid formula and that would be less money spent. So if you're interested in taxes at any level, this would definitely be the amendment because this would be considered in the money that is distributed to schools in the 1059 formula. And those school districts getting this money would have to, as far as I'm concerned, consider this money, the money that we've already spent, the tax money that Millard has already spent, at least we would get some kind of a recognition for that money that we've already spent. So it wouldn't actually be tax relief but it would at least be tax recognition. Thank you.

PRESIDENT ROBAK: Thank you, Senator Witek. Senator Beutler.

SENATOR BEUTLER: Madam President, members of the Legislature, one thing that I would like to start to do now is get some things on the record so if this bill is in fact going to be passed this year, at least we know, have some legislative interpretation of how some of these things are supposed to work. And I know from talking to the Department of Education that they don't have a clue as to how some of these things are supposed to work. So, Senator Robinson, if I may, let me kind of start through the bill and ask you some questions about how this is intended to work, if I could. Senator Robinson.

PRESIDENT ROBAK: Senator Robinson.

SENATOR ROBINSON: Yes, Senator Beutler.

SENATOR BEUTLER: Senator, on page 9 of the bill in lines 12 and 13, right in there, it indicates that the funds will be awarded to particular school districts and as I am reading it, it will be awarded to four buildings that are suitable for direct connection to the statewide public computer information network. Is that right to start with?
